Cubbies® celebrates the spiritual potential of preschoolers (3- 5 year olds) by helping them develop respect for God, His Son & His Word.

Whether it's the fun puppets, the exciting games or all their Cubbies friends, preschoolers simply love it. At Story Time each week, preschoolers learn about God and about His Son, Jesus Christ, the promised Savior.

Non-competitive games build excitement and reinforce lessons.



Sparks is a three year weekly program for school age children in Kindergarten through 2nd grade. Our purpose is to help teach your child about the people and events of the Bible. This builds a foundation of wisdom for knowing Jesus. The Sparks program is firmly grounded in Scripture.



Truth and Training or T&T, for short, engages third through sixth graders and answers their questions about God and the Bible, guiding them through this pivotal life stage to grow in the grace of Jesus Christ.

Awana Bucks

All clubbers earn Awana Bucks throughout the evening. One buck each for: being present at club, wearing the uniform, bringing the book, bringing your Bible, dues paid (\$.50 a week), & participating in special theme nights (see theme calendar for details). They can also earn bucks if their team wins or has great teamwork during game time! Three times a year we will hold an Awana Store where clubbers can spend these bucks on many fun toys and activities.

Dues/Fees

Dues—\$.50 a week—these may be paid for the year via the Awana Front Desk (\$16.00)

Other fees may include purchase of handbooks and uniforms for each clubber.

Scholarships are available.

What we DO!

6:15-6:30—Opening Celebration:

All clubbers and leaders gather in the worship center in rows according to their clubs. They will be led in pledges, the Awana song, announcements & a prayer time.

30 Min—Handbook Time:

Breaking into smaller groups, leaders will listen to the memorized verses & sections. Leaders will also record Awana bucks (see notes about Awana Bucks for details).



30 Min—Game Time:

Clubbers are divided into 4 groups. The groups compete in the gym in special Awana games for a bonus Awana buck. Gym shoes are required.



7:30-8:00—Council Time: Leaders will guide the entire club through a large group lesson. Many of these lessons will have visuals, special guests and/or activities. The clubbers will go through the entire Bible in three years.

8:00—Dismissal: All clubbers **MUST** be picked up by a parent or guardian at the end of each club night using the "Dismissal Code Word" given on the registration form. Dismissal is done from the individual club rooms.
